

There was a James Graham living with William Graham (1787-1856)¹ and Agnes Reid in 1850 Carlisle Pennsylvania. In their daughter's May 27th 1883 will, Elizabeth Graham² of Carlisle Borough indicated a brother James Graham late of Newbern Indiana, and a nephew James H. Graham of North Madison Indiana.ⁱ

James Graham (1813-1879)

James Graham was born August 15th 1813³ to William Graham and Agnes Reid in Scotland.⁴ He was listed as a passenger with his parents and sister, Jane, who landed in Philadelphia November 11th 1816.⁵

James married twice, and his first wife died sometime prior to 1850, and James went to North Madisonⁱⁱ Jefferson County Indiana as a blacksmith. It was in the North Madison area that James married his 2nd wife, Agnes Harrison,⁶ May 21st 1856. Agnes was born about 1826 in England. She was first married to James Mowbray on November 15th 1852 in Bartholomew County Indiana. They had one infant which did not survive, and Mowbray died in 1855.⁷

Shortly after James and Agnes married, the family moved to Newbern in Clifty Township Bartholomew County Indiana.ⁱⁱⁱ In 1860, living with the family in Newbern was four year old Caroline Stickley.

It appears that James was not in any occupation, and by 1870 he had real estate valuing \$20,000.00 and a personal estate value of \$15,000.00.

He was 65 years, 8 months, and 21 days old when he died May 6th 1879. He was laid to rest in the family plot at the Sandhill Cemetery, and then late 1940 his family plot was moved to^{iv} the Garland Brook Cemetery, Columbus in Bartholomew County, Indiana.⁸ FAG#72507955

After his death Agnes continued to live Newbern. In 1880 Agnes was 53 years old and indicated she had a paralysis. Living with her was Thomas, who was 23 years old working as a farm laborer; Joseph was 21 years old living at home, and Agnes was 19 years old and in school.

Agnes was 71 years old on February 2nd 1897 when she died. She was laid to rest with her husband at Sandhill Cemetery, and later moved to the Garland Brook Cemetery.⁹

James had a child before moving to Indiana:

- i. James H. Graham (1840-1928).

James and Agnes Graham children:

- ii. Thomas Hanison Graham was born about 1857 in Newbern Indiana. He lived with his mother up until 1880 in Newbern Indiana. By July 24th 1880 Thomas Hanison Graham applied for a marriage license with Missouri Cordeha Holland,¹⁰ who he married on July 25th 1880 in Bartholomew County Indiana. Albert Carter and Z. H. Hauser officiated the wedding.¹¹

Missouri was born February 1861 in Indiana, and both of her parents were born in North Carolina.

Thomas worked in the merchandise field, and in 1900 he was a deliveryman. The family lived in the 10th precinct of Indianapolis located in Center Township of Marion County Indiana.

In 1920 the family still lived in Indianapolis. Living with them was their son William, and his wife Margaret, and their two children; Lilly (Letitia) May and Paul W. Graham.

By 1950 their granddaughter Letitia was living with them in Indianapolis.

Thomas and Missouri had four children:

- a. Nettie Graham was born March 1881. She married Arthur Murray in 1900. Arthur was born October 1877 in Indiana.
 - b. James E. Graham was born September 1882. In 1900 he was living with his parents and worked as a grocery clerk.
 - c. Edna May Graham was born May 1885. She married George E. Carter February 23rd 1910 in Marion County Indiana. George was born to James F. Carter and Lillian F. Harlow.¹²
 - d. William "Will" G. Graham was born February 1895. In 1920 he and his wife Margaret, and their two children; Lilly May and Paul W. Graham lived with his parents in Indianapolis.
- iii. Joseph Graham was born about 1859 in Newbern Indiana. Joseph married Carrie M. Miller May 15th 1885 in Columbus located in Bartholomew County Indiana. Carrie was born G. E. Miller and Julia Peters in Columbus. J. B. Cobb officiated the wedding.¹³ The family lived in Newbern Indiana.
 - iv. Agnes Graham was born about 1861 in Newbern Indiana. She lived with her mother up until 1880 in Newbern Indiana. We lost track of her in 1900.
 - v. Jennettie Graham was born in 1863. She died at 13 years, 9 months, and 6 days on April 13th 1877. She was laid to rest with her father at the Garland Brook Cemetery.¹⁴

James H. Graham (1840 – 1928)

James H. Graham was born December 1840 in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. James lived with his grandparents until the late 1850's when he went to be with his father in North Madison Jefferson County Indiana.

By 1860 James arrived in North Madison Indiana living in the home of Thomas and Rebecca Taylor, working as a blacksmith. This is the same region his father once lived and worked, which is a railroad town with a large population of engineers, machinist, and blacksmiths.

In 1862 James and Esther "Hettie" Ann Thomas ^v applied for a marriage license on March 1st 1862, and married March 6th 1862 in Jefferson County Indiana. Alexander Parker officiated the wedding. ¹⁵ Hettie was born June 1843 to Samuel Thomas (1805-1855) and Ann Stevenson in Indiana. ¹⁶ Samuel Thomas was a machinist, and it's possible that he and James had worked together in North Madison Indiana.

- There is also an obituary for Ann Stevenson-Thomas, indicating she died in the home of her son, James H. Graham, and she was born in Delaware County Pennsylvania, which is adjacent to Philadelphia Pennsylvania. ¹⁷

On April 22nd 1861 James enlisted as a private into Company K of the 6th Indiana Infantry. By August 2nd 1861 he mustered out of service at Indianapolis, Indiana. ¹⁸ He then enlisted into Company I of the 134th Indiana Infantry. In 1870 his occupation was identified as an engine builder, which is most likely a locomotive or other steam powered engine.

In 1880 James was still a blacksmith, and his father was born in Scotland and his mother in Wales. ¹⁹In 1880 James and Ester lived in North Madison, Jefferson County, Indiana.

Hettie died in 1922, and James died April 30th 1928 in Jefferson County Indiana. They were both laid to rest with their daughter Anna A. Graham in Plot #91 of the Fairmount Cemetery, Madison Jefferson County Indiana. Ester's Thomas family is also in plot 91.

James and Ester had only two children.

- i. James William Graham (1862-1913)
- ii. Anna A. Graham who was born August 1865 in North Madison Indian. She never married, and lived with her parents. She died in 1959, and was laid to rest with her parents in Graham in Plot #91 of the Fairmount Cemetery, Madison Jefferson County Indiana.

James William Graham (1862-1913)

James William Graham²⁰ was born October 21st 1862 in North Madison, Jefferson County Indiana.²¹

James applied for his marriage license, and married Annie Beckett^{vi} on April 8th 1891 in Jefferson County Indiana.²² George W. Gelvin officiated the wedding. Annie was born January 13th 1872 in Indiana.²³ Both her parents were born in England.

The family lived in north Madison Jefferson County Indiana. James died December 23rd 1913, and Annie died September 25th 1936. They were both laid to rest at the Fairmount Cemetery, Madison Jefferson County Indiana.²⁴

James and Nancy had four children.

- i. Gertrude Wadsworth Graham was born October 1891. She married Joseph Thedn Ottinger April 11th 1909 in Marion Indiana. Joseph was born to Phillip Anderson Ottinger and Sarah Margaret Clark.²⁵
- ii. Esther Martha Graham was born March 31st 1893 in Madison County Indiana. She first married David Mack Lee on December 6th 1913 in Anderson Madison County Indiana. David was born January 13th 1892 to Lincoln H. Lee and Eva Cline in Canon Indiana.²⁶

Ester and David lived at 2221 Keystone Street in Indianapolis Indiana, where they had two children when he registered for the WWI draft. He was a bred salesman for the Bryce Baking Company in Indianapolis Indiana.²⁷

Esther then married Charles B. Gerber on April 19th 1920 in Indianapolis Marion County Indiana. David was born to David A. Gerber and Florence E. Hunt.²⁸

- iii. Chandos O. Graham was born November 1894. He married Dora Gladys McFarland August 16th 1919 in Marion County Indiana. Dora was born to William Smithy McFarland and Olney Mary Burleson.²⁹
- iv. Agnes Fay Graham was born October 1896. She married Archie Edward Kessler on April 22nd 1912 in Indianapolis Marion County Indiana. Archie was born to Edward Kessler and Mary Bell Hall.³⁰

^{vi} Every marriage record indicates Annie's last name as Beckett, but on their daughter, Ester's marriage application, Annie's name was identified as Annie Beckett Kessler. This may be an error resulting from another daughter, Agnes, marriage to Archie Kessler.

Samuel Thomas (1805 - 1855)

Samuel Thomas was born 1805 in Maryland. He married Ann Stevenson, who was born December 15th 1811 in Delaware County Pennsylvania.

The family lived in Jeffersonville Clark County Indiana. Samuel was a machinist. He was 49 years and 10 months old when he died in April 1855. He was laid to rest April 15th 1855 in Jeffersonville cemetery. Samuel was then removed from the cemetery and reinterred in Lot 91 of the Fairmount Cemetery in Madison Jefferson County Indiana.³¹

After Samuel died Ann moved the family to North Madison Jefferson County Indiana. She would later live with her daughter and her husband, James H. Graham, where she died September 15th 1881.³² She was laid to rest with her husband and son William H. Thomas in Plot 91 at the Fairmount Cemetery Madison Jefferson County Indiana. Lot 91 is also the lot where James H. Graham (1840-1928) and his wife Ester Thomas were laid to rest.

Samuel and Ann Thomas children included,

- i. Oliver Thomas was born about 1831
- ii. James Thomas was born about 1834
- iii. William H. Thomas was born 1840. He never married and died 1871
- iv. Ester A. Thomas was born 1843. She married James H. Graham (1840-1928).
- v. Samuel Scott Thomas was born about 1846

The will indicated she had a brother James Graham late of Newborn (Newburgh) Indiana, and that her nephew is James H. Graham of North Madison Indiana. Due to handwriting, the word Newborn was hard to read, and since it mentioned the town North Madison, which sat along the Ohio River, we assumed the town Newborn was actually Newburgh. We then used the census records cited in the bibliography to locate and identify details of James Graham's birth, occupation, and his son's family.
