

Introduction

At least one source perpetuates William Graham and Agnes Reid was the parents ¹ of Robert Graham (1805-1887) ² and his brother ³ John Graham (1810-1883), ⁴ which is based on the July 1989 Donna Persky Graham genealogical worksheet. ⁵

In her work, Donna believes that William and Agnes are the parents of John and Robert; "...because William is a blacksmith". All of her other information came from the 1850 census record cited in our bibliography.

There are many common names used among Graham families; James H., Agnes, Elizabeth, and Jane were some of the names we came across. The most common that added confusion was the name, William A. Graham. This name was used six or more ⁶ Graham families in early 19th century Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Each of these men have very similar profiles, including using their middle initial "A" on public records.

The purpose of this paper is to demonstrate that William Graham and Agnes Reid are not the parents of Robert and his brother John Graham. Our findings are fully cited, and are largely based on Estate and grave records of the family, especially their daughter's Elizabeth and her will. ⁷

With this paper, we have determined they are not the parents of our Robert and John Graham. Although they not our Graham patriarch, they could still related in other ways.

William Graham (1787 – 1856)

William Graham was born about 1787 in Scotland (possibly Greenock and the Dumfries Shire areas).

William was a blacksmith, and he married Agnes Reid ⁱ about 1810 in Scotland. ⁸ Agnes was born about 1790-1793 in Scotland. ⁹

William, Agnes, James, and Jane (Jean) Graham arrived in Philadelphia on board the ship Galiot Caledonia on November 11th 1816 from Greenock Scotland. ¹⁰ The family appears to be consigned to Wm Danl (William Daniels or Dale). ¹¹ It was typical during this period that a traveler would be cosigned or ordered, even indentured for their passenger fare of about 45 dollars per person. No naturalization applications have been found for the family. ¹²

We have not located any 1820 references on the family, but by 1830 William and Agnes would have had 1 son 15 years old; 1 daughter 11 years old; 1 daughter 8 years old; 1 daughter 5 to 9 and 1 son 5 to 9; and a son under 5. Six children

By 1840 the family had already arrived in Carlisle Pennsylvania, where they would live in the East Ward; 113 South Pitt Street in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. ¹³ The family lived a few homes away from Thomas and Anna Smith, whose daughter Henrietta would eventually marry their son William A. Graham in 1875.

William died May 16th 1856 in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. There is no will. The Letter of Administration ¹⁴ dated September 8th 1856 identified Elizabeth Graham as administrator for William Graham late of Carlisle and his goods and chattels.

William was laid to rest in the family plot, with his child Jean was laid to rest in 1847, at the Old Graveyard in the Carlisle Borough of Cumberland County Pennsylvania. ¹⁵ FAG#142432245

In 1860 and 1870 Agnes, Janette, and Elizabeth still live in Carlisle. Agnes died shortly after 1870, and she was laid to rest with her husband and children in the Old Graveyard in the Carlisle. ¹⁶

These are the children that we can factually identify, and were born to William and Agnes Graham. ¹⁷
All of the men practiced the trade of blacksmith or machinist.

- i. James Graham (1813-1879) ¹⁸ was born to William Graham and Agnes Reid in Scotland. ¹⁹ James was listed as a passenger with his parents and sister, Jean, who landed in Philadelphia November 11th 1816. ²⁰
- ii. Jean Graham was born 1814 ²¹ to William Graham and Agnes Reid in Scotland. She was listed as Jane Graham on the passenger with her parents and brother, James, when the family landed in Philadelphia on November 11th 1816. ²² Jean was living with the family in 1840 Carlisle, but died in 1847. She was laid to rest in the Old Graveyard in the Carlisle Borough of Cumberland County Pennsylvania. ⁱⁱ
- iii. Jannet Graham was born 1819 ²³ to William Graham and Agnes Reid ⁱⁱⁱ in the Philadelphia area of Pennsylvania. She never married, and lived her entire life with her parents in the borough of Carlisle Pennsylvania. Jannet died Wednesday January 10th 1876. ²⁴ In her will her name is spelled Jannet Graham (no age or birth date was indicated) of Carlisle. The will was dated April 10th 1873, and associated Letter of Administration was dated August 16th 1877. The will also indicated her sister, Elizabeth Graham, as the executor, and witnessed by J. R. Egbert and A. L. Spouslen. ²⁵

Jannet was laid to rest in the Old Graveyard, we assume next to her sister Elizabeth, in the Carlisle Borough of Cumberland County Pennsylvania. ²⁶

- iv. Elizabeth Graham was born 1822^{iv} in Pennsylvania.²⁷ She never married, and lived her entire life with her parents in the borough of Carlisle Pennsylvania. Elizabeth died May 27th 1883.²⁸

Elizabeth made her will on the day she died, dated May 27th 1883. The will indicated she had a brother James Graham late of Newbern Indiana,^v Her nephew is James H. Graham of North Madison Indiana. Elizabeth indicated she had a cousin Mrs. Mary Mitchell of the city of Philadelphia. She also mentioned a brother William A. Graham of the town of Carlisle.

Elizabeth mentioned friends: Miss Harriet and Miss Betsy Ulrich, and Anna Barbara Egby (Epley, Egbert or Eby) all of Carlisle. She also mentioned a servant Sara Ellen Shie, and Mrs. Henrietta Halbert of the town of Carlisle. Witnesses were L. M. Myers and James A. Eby. Her brother William A. Graham is executor of the will.²⁹ Elizabeth was laid to rest in the Old Graveyard, we assume next to her sister Jannet, in the Carlisle Borough of Cumberland County Pennsylvania.³⁰

- v. Unknown Female Graham was born between 1821 and 1825. She would have been between 25 to 29 years old in 1850. She was not in the 1850 family census record.
- vi. Unknown Male Graham was born between 1821 and 1825. This male lived in the family home in 1840 Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. He would have been between 25 to 29 years old in 1850, and he was not in the 1850 family census record.
- vii. William A. Graham was born December 24th 1829^{vi} to William Graham and Agnes Reid in the Philadelphia area of Pennsylvania.³¹ His middle initial "A" may be for "Albert" or "Alexander".

Sometime prior to 1860 William left home, and by 1870 he lived in the home of Joel and Ida Ann Middleton in Ward 2 of Trenton in Mercer County New Jersey. While there William worked as Brick Machine Maker. His later occupation would be recorded as inventor, draftsman, and gentleman.

William married Henrietta Anna Smith June 5th 1872 in Carlisle Pennsylvania. Henrietta was born July 12th 1839 to Thomas Smith and Anna McKensey in Pennsylvania.³² Thomas Smith was born about 1801 in Pennsylvania, and died prior to 1850. Anna McKensey was born about 1802 in Pennsylvania. The Smith family lived in the west ward of Carlisle, where in 1870 Henrietta was working as a seamstress.

^{iv} William would be 35 years old and Agnes 32 years old when Elizabeth was born in 1819.

^v It was difficult to read the handwriting, which appeared to be written as, Newborn Indiana. We interpreted as Newbern Indiana. Newbern is in Bartholomew County, which is about 59 miles north of North Madison Indiana, where his son James lived.

^{vi} William would be 42 years old and Agnes 39 years old when William A. was born in 1829.

The family lived at 249 and 113 South Pitt Street, and later in life at 271 East Pomfert Street, all in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania.³³ William A. and Henrietta never had any children. William lived at 325 South Pitt Street when he died at the age of 85 years, 2 months and 11 days old March 4th 1915. He was laid to rest March 6th 1915 in the Old Grave Yard located in Carlisle Pennsylvania.³⁴

After William's death Henrietta moved to West Pomfert Street Carlisle. While living here, she dies at 96 years, 8 months, and 23 days on April 4th 1936. She was laid to rest next to her husband April 7th 1936 at the Old Grave Yard located in Carlisle Pennsylvania.³⁵

William and Henrietta never had any children.

These Children Could Belong to James Graham

- viii. Unknown Male born 1831 to 1835.^{vii} The child lived in the family home in 1840, but was not identified in the 1850 census record with Esther. No mention of this child was in any of the estate records.
- ix. Esther Graham was born about 1833.^{viii} She lived with William and Agnes until sometime after 1850, when no further data could be found. Ester was not mentioned in any estate records, including Jannet's 1873 will or Elizabeth's 1883 will.

^{vii} William would be between 44 and 48 years old and Agnes between 36 and 40 years old when this male child was born sometime between 1831 and 1835. Because of these ages, we believe the child is the son of James.

^{viii} William would be 46 years old and Agnes 43 years old when Ester was born in 1833. Because of these ages, we believe that Esther is the daughter of James.
