- OF_(00) 1885 photo of the Liverpool Canal located in Perry County Pennsylvania.
- OF_(05) 1895 photo of the town, Dauphin, located along the Susquehanna River outside Harrisburg in Dauphin County Pennsylvania.
- OF_(10) Circa 1912 photo of an Old Blacksmith Shop in Clear Springs, which is located in Franklin Township within the northern York County area of Pennsylvania. 1st blacksmith shop operated by George Hull; the little girl is Lucinda Hull, who married Lewis King. Lucinda is the sister of John and Ralph Hull. The lady is Lucinda's mother, Gartha Hull, and the man with no hat is Gartha's husband, George Hull. The man with the hat is Evans. (Most likely Evans is his last name.) OF_(10A) is what is written on the back of the photo.

Northern York County School Photos

The following photos are from Dulcet Cortege. They are of a teacher Margaret Baker, and of the Smith and Elicker children, in various schools within the present day Northern York County School District.

There is a book; The Story of the One-Room School: In the Townships of the Northern York County School District, by Dr. Brain Small, that can purchased from the Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society.

DC_(01) 1911 school; Margaret Baker and her brother Mervin are sitting beside each other to the left in the front row. Their other brother, Parker Baker, is in the front row 7th from the left. The bothers have the same style and pattern of shirts.

DC_(02) 1923 Dillsburg High School Graduation Class; Margaret Baker is sitting to the left in the front row. Her brother Mervin is in the back row, 3rd from the left. Mervin is one year older then Margaret, but they are graduating together.

The next set of photos is of classes that Margaret Baker taught in the Dillsburg area. If you have the book on the one room schools in Dillsburg, you'll see her name in the listing of teachers.

The next 2 school pictures are of the Smith children attending school, which we're pretty sure is a school that sat directly across the road from present day South Mountain Elementary, where Northern Apartments are located.

- DC_(08) Circa 1913 School; Glenn Smith is in the 2nd row, 2nd from the left. His sister Hazel Smith may be the girl in the back row, against the brick wall, 2nd from left.
- DC_(10) Circa 1914 School; Glenn Smith is 2nd row, far left. Other Smith children would be in here too, but they can't be identified.

This set is the Elicker children attending school. DC (12) is clearly labeled Glenwood 1902. DC (13) is marked 1910, and it may be the school in Dillsburg. DC (14) is a photo of a large number of students, which is dated circa 1913. We're still researching all of the photos.

- DC_(12) 1920 Glenwood School; Russell Elicker is in the front row next to the teacher.
- DC_(13) 1910 School; Russell Elicker is back row, 6th from the left, standing next to the girl.
- DC_(14) 1913 School; Russell Elicker is standing in the 2nd row from the back, 4th in from the right, the 1st tall male beside three younger boys.
- DC_(15) Central School September 28th 1950; Karen Smith is in the 2nd row, far left. Her sister, Carol Smith, is in the 3rd row, 3rd from the left.
- DC_(16) White Hall School. Eugene and Jay Elicker
