This is a geneological interpretation on the Meclchoir Barr Sr. and Jr. family from pages 33 to 42 of the History of Lehigh County Pennsylvania, and a Genological and Biographical Record of its Families. Any and all information form the book was captured that helped identify current and future Baer family relationships. <sup>1</sup>

The Baer family of Lehigh county are decendants fro Melchior Baer, Sr., who is said to have emigrated from Zweibrucken in the Palatinate area of Germany. The family is said to be an old Palatinate family whose family seat was at Bärenhütte Germany. It is also related that Peter Von Baer in the distant past was married to a daughter to the Count of the Platinate.

The family is originally said to hav been of Swiss origin. The parish of Bar, the church in which is said to have been built by emperor Charles in the 5<sup>th</sup> century, derives its name from the family of Bar, whose name appears in Swiss History as early as 1245. Melchoir Baer Sr., Melchoir Jr., Johannes, and Chrostophel came across the Atlantic on the ship Phoenix and landed in Philadelphia Septemebr 30<sup>th</sup> 1743.

My Barr Line...Melchoir Baer Sr. was baptized in Ottenbach Germany <sup>2</sup> on Fbrary 17<sup>th</sup> 1688. He was buried in the Schlosser's Reformed Cemetery located in North Whitehall in present day LehighCounty Pennsylvania. Melchoir Baer I (Sr.). married Elizabeth Gneser January 13<sup>th</sup> 1710. Elisabeth was batized Decemebr 24<sup>th</sup> 1689 in Ottenbach Germany. <sup>3</sup>

Mekchoir Baer Sr., apparently made his home with his son Melhoir Jr., until in 1762, when Melchoir Jr. sold the homestead to his father, Melchoir Sr., and removed to Macungie Township Lancaster County.

In 1769 Melchoir Sr., sold the homestead to his other son, John Peter Baer, whom he in his will designates as his chief heir at law. Melchoir (I) Baer and Elisabeth Gneser had eight childen.

#### Melchoir Baer II (Jr.) (1726 – 1773)

My Barr Line...Melchoir Baer was born January 6<sup>th</sup> 1726 to Melchoir Baer (I) and Elisabeth Gneser in the Fatherland (Germany), and died February 28<sup>th</sup> 1773. He was buried in a small private cemetery near Zionsville (present day Upper Milford Township) Lehigh County Pennsylvania.

Melchoir Baer II married a much younger woman, Eva Elisabeth Christman, a daughter of Jacob and Eva Margaret Christman <sup>6</sup> of Lynn Township. <sup>7</sup> Melchoir's estate will speaks of eight children, but only mentions two, Jacob and Melchoir. In his final 1812 estate petition settlement, eight children where listed.

- i. Elisabeth Baer who died prior to 1812. She married Lorentz Kern
- ii. Regina Baer who married Jacob Haman, and she died prior to 1812.
- iii. Margaret Baer who married Philip Christman.
- iv. Barbara Baer was born 1760 and died 1845. She married Nicholas Stahler.

My Barr Line... Page 38....Jacob Baer was born about 1770 near Macungie to Melchoir Baer II (Jr.) and Elisabeth Gneser in present day Lehigh County Pennsylvania. Jacob followed the trade of carpet weaver. He died about 1858, age upwards of eighty years. Jacob was buried at Zionsville. Among the children of Jacob was Manasses Baer.

i. Manasses Baer was born near Macungie March 17<sup>th</sup> 1826 to Jacob Baer. Manasses followed the shoemaking trade for some years, whereupon he returned to farming in Upper Milford Township Lehigh County Pennsylvania.

Manasses married Lucetta Niederauer about 1840. Lucetta was born about 1824 to Jacob Niederauer. Jacob only had two daughters; Lucretta and Caroline Niederauer. Caroline died unmarried. Jacob was born about 1792 in Upper Milford Township in present day Lehigh County Pennsylvania. <sup>11</sup> Lucretta died March 1900 at age 76.

Manasses sold his farm two years prior, about 1865, <sup>12</sup> to the construction of the Perkiomen Railroad <sup>13</sup> and bought a farm in Newberry Township York County Pennsylvania. While living in York County he followed the drover business.

Manasses Baer and Lucretta Niederauer had the following children.

# Joseph Barr (born 1852)

My Line....Page 38 and 39....Joseph Baer was born to Manasses Barr and Lucretia Niederauer <sup>14</sup> March 14<sup>th</sup> 1852. <sup>15</sup> With this generation, the spelling of the name was changed from Baer to Barr, due to the insistence of an English schoolteacher. Joseph attended the public schools to about sixteen, worked two years on his father's farm. In 1870 he learned the carpenter trade, at which he worked for five years and thereupon for same time at machinist trade. Afterwards for about five years he was an engineer, then boss at the Emaus furnace for two years.

Moving to Pottstown Montgomery County, he built the rolling mill for Hope Iron Company and when they sold their plant. He was employed by the Warwick Iron Company as chief engineer. Returning to Emaus, he prepared plans and constructed the Emaus Pipe Foundry, returning again to Pottstown, he built the Ellis-Lessig Iron Mills Company, Montgomery Co. See: Ellis and Lessig's Rolling Mill Pottstown Pennsylvania (ca.1884-?).

On March 23, 1865, Act 741 was passed by the Pennsylvania legislature, under which the Norristown and Allentown Railroad Company became the Perkiomen Railroad Company. The Reading's Perkiomen Branch was a parallel route to the North Penn Branch between the Philadelphia area and the Lehigh Valley.

Coming to Allentown, Pa., August 14<sup>th</sup> 1888, he became interested in the cement business, being associated with the Lehigh Portland Cement Company. He is a member of the Lutheran Church, Republican in politics, member of 100 F Unity Encampment and Rebekah, No. 72, 100 F and B. P.O.E.

Joseph married Mary Wasser, who was born in 1852, and died in 1895. Mary was the daughter of James and Anna Wasser. Joseph was 44 years old when he then married a second time to a 30 year old Ruth Etta Traver on June 10<sup>th</sup> 1897 in Montgomery County Pennsylvania. Ruth was born in 1869 to John D. Traver. <sup>ii</sup>

Joseph died 1933, and his 1<sup>st</sup> wife Mary C. Barr died in 1895, and his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife Ruth Barr died in 1943. They were laid to rest Pottstown Cemetery, Pottstown, Montgomery County Pennsylvania.

The following are the children of Joseph and his 1<sup>st</sup> wife, Mary. He had no children with Ruth.

- i. Ellen Jane Barr was born December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1868, and married Frank Stalhl of Philadelphia.
- ii. Annie Mariah Barr was born September 13<sup>th</sup> 1872, and married Harry Endy of Pottstown.

He was married, Sept. 15, 1910, to Laura Wirthlin, a daughter of Frank and Laura (Wetzel) Wirthlin, of Cincinnati, Ohio.
- vii. Harvey Joseph Barr was born May 7<sup>th</sup> 1870, and married Sarah H. (Sally) Ellis of Pottstown. According to the marriage application and license we know the following: The application date was April 2 1892, and the date on the license is April 7<sup>th</sup> 1892. Harvey was 21 years old, marrying 1 month shy of his 22<sup>nd</sup> birthday, and he listed his residence as Pottstown PA. Sarah was 19 years old, suggesting she was born in 1873. Her middle initial was H., and her parents were James, and her mother was named Sarah. She listed her residence as 1139 N. 11<sup>th</sup> Street, Reading Pennsylvania.

## Daniel Baer (1790-1841)

Daniel Baer was born November 19<sup>th</sup> 1790 to Melchoir Baer III and Catherine Desch. He died October 28<sup>th</sup> 1841. Daniel married Susan Neumoyer who was born January 15<sup>th</sup> 1791 and died November 30<sup>th</sup> 1871. Daniel and Susan had twelve children:

And became a travelling salesman. In 1893 he entered into business with his brother, Charles Baer, and they manufactured furniture in Allentown. George married Hester W. Trexler April 2<sup>nd</sup> 1882, who ws the daughter of Daniel Trexler. George and Hester lived at 1036 Walnut Street Allentown Pennsylvania. George and Hester had one son.
  - a. George F. Baer who was born September 4<sup>th</sup> 1883 and graduated from Medical School in Philadelphia in 1905.
- ii. Charles H. Baer was born February 27<sup>th</sup> 1874 to Henry Baer in Allentown Pennsylvania. He graduated high school in 1889, and later Muhlenburg College. Charles married Annie H. Lackey in June 1905. Annie was born in Meadville Pennsylvania to John Lackey and Annie McCracken. Charles was in the furniture business with his older brother, George Baer. Charles and Annie lived at 25 North 5<sup>th</sup> Street Allentown. No children where listed at the time this book was written.
