Annie Catherine Graham - Agle (1860 – 1921)

Annie Catherine Graham was born September 16th 1860 to William Graham (1833-1908)¹ and Mary Oliver ² or Mary E. Allewelt ³ in Shippensburg Pennsylvania.

Annie married Edward Tobias Agle on October 18th 1877. ⁴ Edward was born June 20th 1854 to Jacob Agle (1827-1863) ⁵ and Regina Waltrick in Shippensburg Pennsylvania. ⁶ Edward and his brother, Abner, attended the White Hall soldiers' orphans' school in Camp Hill Cumberland County Pennsylvania. They enrolled on September 3rd 1866, and were discharged January 9th 1869.

Annie ⁱ and Edward lived in Shippensburg Cumberland County and Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. He was a plasterer by trade and was in business with his brother Abner Agle of Shippensburg. Since 1886 he and Annie were members of the Shippensburg Church of God.⁷

In 1900, residing with the Annie and Edward Agle in Shippensburg was Catharine Thrush. Catherine was born December 1819, and was the mother of 2 children, but no child was living in 1900. Also in the census record, Catherine was identified as being a grandmother of Edward.ⁱⁱ

• Our great-grandfather, William Henry Graham, lived with Lenard and Catherine Thrush after William's mother died in 1874. In the 1880 census record, Lenard was born about 1800, and his wife was born about 1820.

In 1916 the Agle family moved from Shippensburg Cumberland County to Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. ⁸ In 1920 Edward and Annie are living with their daughter Mary Agle-Snoke in Harrisburg Pennsylvania.

Annie was 61 years old when she died November 30th 1921 at the home of her daughter, Mary Snoke, in Harrisburg Dauphin County. ⁹ Funeral services were held at her daughter's home Friday, December 2nd 1921. They were conducted by her pastor, T.M. funk, and assisted by her former pastor Rd. I.A. MacDonald of Mt. Joy of Lancaster County, and Dr. Houck of Harrisburg. ¹⁰ Annie was laid to rest December 2nd 1921 at the East Harrisburg Cemetery, ⁱⁱⁱDauphin County Pennsylvania. FAG# 94208936.

Edward was 68 years old when he died Tuesday 4:30 P.M. November 7th 1922 at his daughters, Mary Agle-Snoke's home located at 523 Seneca Street Harrisburg Pennsylvania. His funeral services were held at his home on Friday afternoon, November 10th 1922, at 1:30 o'clock, the Rev. T. M. Funk of the First Church of God, officiating. ¹¹ Edward was laid to rest in next to his wife, November 10th 1922, in the East Harrisburg Cemetery, Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. ¹² FAG# 94209237 ^{iv}
