Cousins - Generations - Great Grandparents

To be "once removed" from a cousin means you are separated by one generation. The number before "removed" will always represent the number of generations you are separated ("removed") from the cousin.

Parents:

- Paternal
- Maternal

First cousins share a grandparent (2 generations)

• 1st cousin – grandparents - 2nd generation

Second cousins share a great-grandparent (3 generations)

• 2nd cousin – great-grandparents – 3rd generation

Third cousins share a great-great-grandparent (4 generations)

• $3^{rd} \operatorname{cousin} - 2^{nd} \operatorname{great-grandparents} - 4^{th} \operatorname{generation}$

Fourth cousins share a 3rd great-grandparent (5 generations)

• $4^{st} \operatorname{cousin} - 3^{rd} \operatorname{great-grandparents} - 5^{th} \operatorname{generation}$

Fifth cousins share a 4th great grandparent (6 generations)

• $5^{st} \operatorname{cousin} - 4^{th} \operatorname{great-grandparents} - 6^{th} \operatorname{generation}$

Sixth cousins share a 5th great grandparent (7 generations)

• $6^{\text{th}} \operatorname{cousin} - 5^{\text{th}} \operatorname{great-grandparents} - 7^{\text{th}} \operatorname{generation}$

Seventh cousins share a 6th great grandparent (8 generations)

• $7^{th} \operatorname{cousin} - 6^{th} \operatorname{great-grandparents} - 8^{th} \operatorname{generation}$

Eighth cousins share a 7th great grandparent (9 generations)

• $8^{th} \operatorname{cousin} - 7^{th} \operatorname{great-grandparents} - 9^{th} \operatorname{generation}$
