## James Graham (1835-1911)

James Graham was born October 26<sup>th</sup> 1835<sup>1</sup> to John Graham and Lydia Devor in Jackson Township Perry County Pennsylvania. James married Angeline Gross Thursday, August 25<sup>th</sup> 1859.<sup>2</sup> Angeline was born in June 6<sup>th</sup> 1836<sup>3</sup> to Andrew Gross of Hopewell Township, Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>4</sup>

James was a carpenter who was 5' 5" tall with light hair and blue eyes. He and Angeline lived in Hopewell Township, Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Besides being a carpenter, he operated a farm, which was located south of Newburg Cumberland County Pennsylvania. He worked as a farmer, fence maker, and Copper (Barrel Maker).

On July 13<sup>th</sup> 1863 James Graham, a carpenter, living in Hopewell Township Cumberland County, enlisted into federal service at Carlisle by Captain R. M. Henderson. <sup>5</sup> On September 1<sup>st</sup> 1864 he entered into Company "I" of the 9<sup>th</sup> Pennsylvania Calvary, as part of the 115<sup>th</sup> Pennsylvania Volunteer Veteran Reserve Corp. James served for 8 months and 26 days. He was discharged May 29<sup>th</sup> 1865. <sup>6</sup>

In 1860 and 1870<sup>7</sup> James was a carpenter, and owned his own property worth \$1000, while his personal property was \$500. The family lived in the Newburg area of Hopewell Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>8</sup> Children of James and Angeline: In 1911 seven children were still living. By 1916 three sons and two daughters were living.<sup>9</sup>

- i. Sarah H. Graham was born June 1859. In her brother, David Graham's, 1916 obituary she was referred to as Mrs. Smith of Newburg.<sup>10</sup>
- ii. David Theodore <sup>11</sup> Graham was March 11<sup>th</sup> 1862 in Hopewell Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. David married Martha Elizabeth Farner who was born 1857, and died 1923.
- iii. Agnes Graham was born 1864 in Hopewell Township. In her father's 1911 will Agnes was referred to as Ellen Carbaugh. In her brother, David Graham's, 1916 obituary Agnes was referred to as Mrs. Carbaugh of Shippensburg.<sup>12</sup>

When Agnes was 26 years old when she married a 24 year old William H. Allison on April 29<sup>th</sup> 1891 at her parent's home in Newburg Hopewell Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. William was born in 1867 to Augustus and Mary Allison.<sup>13</sup>

Agnes married Mr. Allison of Shippensburg and later Mr. Smith.<sup>14</sup>

iv. John A. Graham was born 1866 in Hopewell Township. John died in 1875 at 9 years old in Newburg.

- v. Edward Andrew Graham was born February or May 1870 in Hopewell Township.<sup>15</sup> He was 22 years old when he married 22 year old Bessie E. Miller on January 19<sup>th</sup> 1893 at Newburg Hopewell Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Bessie was born in 1871 to Daniel A. and Elizabeth E. Miller.<sup>16</sup> Their Children:
  - a. Velva Graham was born February 1894. She was 28 years old when she married 21 year old William L. Marpole on December 28<sup>th</sup> 1911 in Shippensburg Pennsylvania. William was born 1890 to John Marpole. Velva died December 23<sup>rd</sup> 1913. <sup>17</sup>
  - b. Arthur Stanley Graham was born May 5<sup>th</sup> 1910 in Cumberland County. He married Bertha O. and they had Joseph Graham, Lydia Graham, Mackey Graham, and Mixell Graham. Stanley died in 1990.<sup>18</sup>
- vi. Clara Zora Graham was born December 1872 in Hopewell Township. In her 1<sup>st</sup> marriage to Joseph Mowery, Clara identified James and Angelina as her parents. In 1900 Frank Graham was the ward of William and Clara Stouffer in Southampton Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>19</sup>

Clara was 20 years old when she married 23 year old Joseph Harvey Mowery on December 7<sup>th</sup> 1893 at her parent's home in Newburg Hopewell Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Joseph was born 1870 to Sarah Mowery.<sup>20</sup>

Joseph Mowery died May 1894, and Clara at 24 years old remarried a 44 year old William A. Stouffer on February 11<sup>th</sup> 1896 in Newville Cumberland County Pennsylvania. William was born 1852 to Jacob and Anna Stouffer. He was also previously married, and his wife died January 1880.<sup>21</sup>

Joseph had one daughter from his previous marriage, Emma L. Stouffer, who Clara adopted. Emma was born February 1898.

We believe Angeline Graham died resulting from child birth complications on December 29<sup>th</sup> 1872 at 36 years, 6 months, and 23 days old. <sup>22</sup> She was laid to rest in the cemetery where the Newburg Church of God was once standing in Newburg, Hopewell Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania.

James then married Caroline Devor who was born April 17<sup>th</sup> 1840<sup>23</sup> to Richard M. (b. 1803) and Leah (b. 1806) Devor. Children of James and Caroline:

In the 1900 census record, Caroline indicated she had three children, and one was still living.

- vii. Franklin Elmer Graham was born February 6<sup>th</sup> 1873 in Hopewell Township. He married Eliza Katherine Hall.<sup>24</sup>
- viii. Christian Paul Graham married 1<sup>st</sup> to Maria Holly who died in 1892, and 2<sup>nd</sup> to Mrs. Catherine Miller. He's not with James in 1880 or 1910. We can't locate or verify this person. May have died prior to 1900.

ix. Charlie M. Graham was born January 1881 in Hopewell Township. In 1900 he was listed as a son, and a farm laborer with a 4<sup>th</sup> grade education, living with his parents. After that there is no record of this person. May have died prior to his mother, Caroline's, death in 1901.

Caroline Devore-Graham died December 17<sup>th</sup> 1901 at 61 years, 8 months, and 0 days. In 1910 James Graham, age 74, lived with Margaret Graham, who was noted as being a cousin, in Hopewell Twp Cumberland Co. James listed being married once (M1), and for 50 years, married about 1860. Margaret listed herself as single, 62 years old, born about 1848 in Pennsylvania.<sup>25</sup>

James Graham died at his home in Newburg on April 12<sup>th</sup> 1911 at 75 years, 5 months, and 17 days, and was laid to rest the cemetery where the Newburg Church of God was once standing in Newburg, Hopewell Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>26</sup>

James's will was dated March 21<sup>st</sup> 1911. The executor of his will was his son, David T. Graham.<sup>27</sup> Also mentioned was his sister-in-law, Miss Margaret Devor. Margaret was the sister of his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife, Caroline Devor.

• Franklin Elmer Graham Parents: If Frank's birth year is 1874, David Graham would have been 13 years old, and Elizabeth Farner would have been 17 years old. This is possible, and a little weird. But then in the 1900 Frank Graham Census, he was listed as a ward in the home of W. A. and Clara Stouffer, and his birth was recorded as February 1876. And according to the 1900 census record, David and Martha where married for 18 years (married in 1882), and Martha

indicated she had 7 children and only 6 were still living. All censuses are cited in the Bibliography.
