

Julia Ann Nonemaker (1856-1907)

Julia Ann ⁱNonemaker was born April 3rd 1856 ⁱⁱ to George Nonemaker and Mary Ann Shenefelt in Baltimore, Maryland. ¹

She lived with the family, and by 1870 she lived in the Three Springs post office area of Clay Township, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania.

In her younger days Julia was a consistent member of the M. E. church.

Sometime around 1874 Julia married Samuel B. R. Culbertson and moved to Alliance, Stark County, Ohio.

- Samuel B. R. Culbertson was previously married to Mary S. Nearon on December 19th 1871 in New Kingston, Middlesex Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania by W. W. Wanbaugh. Witnessed by David H. Wanbaugh and John A. Linsdorf. ²⁻³
- Samuel and Mary had a son, my great grandfather, William Culbertson, who was born September 12th 1873.

Samuel and Julia continued to live in Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, where their two children would be born. By June 12th 1880 census 25-year-old Julia was living with 66-year-old David Brickly and 71-year-old Elizabeth Brickly in Newton Township, Trumbull County, Ohio.

- Julia's children were 5-year-old Mary, and 6-month-old Joseph. The Culbertson family were identified as visitors, and Julia was working as a house keeper. There may be a relationship between Julia and the Brickly family.

Soon after 1880, Julia left Ohio, and returned to Three Springs, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania. While there she married George Montgomery, and in September 9th 1882, her son, James Harry Montgomery was born in Three Springs, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania. ⁴⁻⁵

In 1900 Julia Montgomery was living with John McKnight Campbell,⁶ who was single and a farmer, born December 1856 in Pennsylvania. Julia was working as a servant in the Neelyton, area of Dublin Township, Huntingdon County.ⁱⁱⁱ

Beginning in 1906 Julia began to become ill from Brights disease.^{iv} She succumbed to the illness on April 17th 1907 while living near Neelyton, Dublin Township, Huntingdon County.

She was laid to rest at the Cherry Grove Cemetery, Three Springs, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania. John Cambell from Neelyton, Dublin Township, Huntingdon County, was the informant on her death certificate.⁷ FAG#: 93051493^v

- The inscription on her head stone: Julia A. Wife of Samuel, Aged 51yrs 9ms 20ds.

In her obituary the following family members were mentioned.⁸

- Married first husband, Samuel Culbertson, who passed away about thirty years ago.

 - Joseph Culbertson of Robertsdale
- Her last husband was George Montgomery, one son survives

- Also surviving aged parents and three brothers and six sisters
 - Mr. and Mrs. George Nonemaker
 - John and Geroge Nonemaker of Cheery Grove
 - Moses Nonemaker of Altoona
 - Mrs. Jacob Wible of Mt. Carmel
 - Mrs. Abe Hershey of Robertsdale
 - Mrs. George Hampton of Neelyton
 - Mrs. Annie Edwards of Harrisburg
 - Mrs. Jennie Price and Lizzie Ciapper of Altoona

Julia A. Nonemaker and Samuel B. R. Culbertson had two children:

- i. Mary Jeneta Culbertson (1875-1953). She married Denver S. Runk (1915-1990).⁹
 - o Mary is the ancestor of E.C. managed by missim27, who is my Ancestry autosomal DNA match.¹⁰
- ii. Joseph Samuel Culbertson (1880-1947). He married Vera M. (1913-1994). Their daughter was Norma Slider (1932-2006).¹¹
 - o Joseph is the ancestor of joycebeam, who is my Ancestry autosomal DNA match.¹²

Julia Nonemaker and George W. Montgomery had one son.

- iii. James Harry Montgomery (1887–1951). He married Vara Gholson Teague.

James Harry Montgomery (1887–1951)

James Harry Montgomery was born September 17th 1882 to Julia Nonemaker and George W. Montgomery in Three Springs, Huntingdon County, Pennsylvania. ^{13_14_15}

In 1900 17-year-old James lived with his grandparents, Jacob and Elizabeth Montgomery in Three Springs, Huntingdon County. Living with them were Jacob and Elizabeth Montgomery's daughter, 25-year-old Edwinna Coresh, and her 1-year-old daughter, Ruth E. Coresh.

James was 25 years old, living in Sutter Creek, Amador County, California, when he married 19-year-old Vera Teague on November 10th 1912 in Clark County, Indiana. ¹⁶

- Vara Gholson Teague was born October 9th 1893 in Rose Creek, Webster County, Kentucky.

When James was 35 years old, he signed up for the WW I draft. He and his wife lived in Rural Delivery #1 in Three Springs, Clay Township, Huntingdon County. At that time, James worked as a contractor for the Mt. Union Refractory Company in Three Springs. ¹⁷

In 1930 the family lived in Parkesburg, Chester County, Pennsylvania. James was a foreman for the steel mill. Ruth and Lucille were 15 years old, and James Harry Montgomery Jr. was 3 years old.

By April 1942, when James signed up for the WW II draft, the family lived at 129 Gay Street in Parkesburg, Chester County, Pennsylvania. At that time James worked for the Lukens Steel Company of Coatesville, Chester County. ¹⁸

James died September 22nd 1951 in Parkesburg, Chester, Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest at the Upper Octorara Presbyterian Church Cemetery, Sadsbury Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania. ¹⁹ FAG#: 35144152 ^{vi}

Vara died February 25th 1980 in Parkesburg, Chester, Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest with her husband at the Upper Octorara Presbyterian Church Cemetery. FAG#: 35144151 ^{vii}
