equity as follows. viz:

In the Court of Common Pleas
of York County sitting in equity

To The Hon. The Judges of the Court of Common
Pleas of York County Penna sitting in equity. Between
Jacob Sleigh plaintiff and Anna Mary Weber and Lorentz
Weber her husband defendants - Your orator complains
and says:

First. That Louisa his wife, and her sister Mary
Sheider are the only heirs at law and next of kin to
one Conrad Kissner late of said County who died on the 5th day
of April last past, seized of no real estate but possessed of monies and
other personal property worth about eight hundred dollars

Second- That on the 15th day of April 1869 said Anna Mary Weber
of Manchester Township said County and Lorentz Weber her husband
produced before the Register of Wills of said County a certain paper writ-
ting purporting to be the last will and testament of said Conrad Kissner
and bequeathing or pretending to bequeath to said Anna Mary Weber all his
estate and effects and names her ^{said Anna Mary} executrix of said Will.

Third. And your petitioner further shows that said alleged will appears
to have been executed in the City of Baltimore and State of Maryland on
the day 1869 whilst said Conrad was temporarily in that
city in company with said Anna Mary: That said Conrad Kissner was a
man of great age, grossly intemperate habits, nearly blind and easily im-
posed upon and that your petitioners have good reason to believe and do
believe that said alleged will was procured by undue and improper
influences.

Fourth- That said alleged will was admitted to probate by said Reg-
ister on the 15th day of April aforesaid but no letters Testamentary or of
administration were taken thereon by said Anna Mary or any other per-
son. Yet the said Anna Mary Weber and her husband Lorentz Weber have
taken possession of said estate monies and effects and are acting as Adminis-
trators de son tort, and have disposed of their own effects and are about to remove be-
yond the limits of this Commonwealth and carry with them the estate and effects of said
deceased as aforesaid

Fifth:- And your Orator further shows that he is a creditor of the estate of said deceased
to the amount of about four hundred dollars for board, lodging &c of said deceased in his
lifetime.

Sixth:- Wherefore he pray the Court to award against said Lorentz Weber and Anna Mary
Weber the Commonwealth writ of De Reat Republica or that they may be restrained from
removing beyond the limits of this Commonwealth with the said Estate and effects
and that your petitioners may have such other and further relief as the Court shall
deem meet
