And shall abide and not depart the Court without leave; then this recognizance to be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

THE GRAND INQUEST of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in-
quiring for the County of York, upon their respective oaths and affirmations,
do present, That Jacob Schleich

late of the said County Yeoman, on the Nineteenth day of
April in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and
seventy Three at the County aforesaid, and within the jurisdiction of this
Court, with force and arms, &c., did unlawfully, wilfully
and maliciously, injure break, and destroy
the door belonging to the dwelling house of
one Margaret Stemple there situate, contrary
to the form of the act of the General Assem-
bly in such case made and provided and
against the peace and dignity of the Com-
monwealth of Pennsylvania.

And this Inquest aforesaid on their said
oaths and affirmations aforesaid do fur-
ther present that the said Jacob Schleich
(afterwards to wit, on the same day and year
aforesaid at the County aforesaid and
within the jurisdiction of this Court
with force and arms, &c., did unlawfully
wilfully and maliciously throw stones at
and against the door of the dwelling house
of one Margaret Stemple there situate, and
did then and there, injure, break and des-
troy the door of said dwelling house, contrary
to the form of the act of the General Assembly in
such case made and provided, and against
the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of
Pennsylvania.
