THE GRAND INQUEST of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, inquiring for the County of York, upon their respective oaths and affirmations, do present, That Jacob Schleich

late of the said County yeoman, on the Nineteenth day of April in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and seventy three at the County aforesaid, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, with force and arms, &c. did unlawfully, wilfully and maliciously, injure break, and destroy the door belonging to the dwelling house of one Margaret Temple there situate, contrary to the form of the act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

And this Inquest aforesaid on their said oaths and affirmations aforesaid do further present that the said Jacob Schleich afterwards to-wit, on the same day and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid and within the jurisdiction of this Court with force and arms &c. did unlawfully, wilfully and maliciously throw stones at and against the door of the dwelling house of one Margaret Temple there situate, and did then and there, injure, break and destroy the door of said dwelling house, contrary to the form of the act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
