Helen here what I think. Henry's father is George Taylor born ca 25 Jan 1777 died 26 July 1858 age 80-7-1. Henry died Aug 26, 1868 age 66-6-7. From this he was born Feb 13, 1802. In the 1850 census page 94 for York Township we have Henry 48, a farmer, Barbara 47, Zacariah 24 and William 20 and Barbara 74. She is no doubt Henry's mother. Zachariah married Christina about Jan 1888 and William married Lydia. In 1840 Hopewell census There is a Henry 40-50 and wife 30-40 and a male 10-15 and a male 5-10. In the 1830 Schrewsbury census on page 447 is Henry 30-30 1 female 20-30 and 2 Males 0-5. This also fits. The only Taylors with a male 18 in the 1820 York co. Census are Jacob of Hopewell, John of Newberry, Peter of Lower Chanceford and George of Shrewsbury.

Henry Taylor shows up as a laborer with 1 cow in the 1827 Shrewsbury tax record. A John Seides is a farmer in Shrewsbury with 220A in 1827. Other Taylors in Shrewsbury are John with 116A, George with 247A and Abraham with 60A. Abraham is 51 in the 1850 census so he's not Henry's father. I didn't look hard for John. However George died 26 July 1858 age 80-7-1 which gives a birth of 25 Dec 1777. Making him old enough to be Henry's father. George is buried in the Lutheran Cem in Shrewsbury and Magdalene Taylor buried there also died age 64-9-19 on 7 June 1847 making her 17 or 18 when Abraham is born which is OK.

George's father is probably Abraham who was in Shrewsbury in the 1772 taxes and was a baptism sponsor in 1765 for Philip Schneider's son Abraham. Assuming one should be 21 to be a sponsor Abraham born before 1744. Abraham may also be Abraham Schneider (snyder) and possibly Philip's brother. Abraham had children by wife Elizabeth recorded in 1770, 1772 and 1783.

In Blymmire's Cem is a stone with ZACHARIAH, Henry, Barbary wife of Henry, Lydia Ann wife of Wm H., Wm H, and Barbara E a 2 yr old dau of Wm and L.A.

I didn't look in to Abraham. He could be in the Immigration books.
